CPD – Internal learning and development	£3,380	Increased confidence in staff on the delivery of PE and school sport.
CPD – Online training and resource development	£2,274	Increased knowledge and expertise of PE specialist staff who have then been able to disseminate this knowledge to others.
Internal school based extra-curricular opportunities	£10,140	Specialist PE staff have planned and delivered Explorer sessions at lunchtimes, targeted towards all children to increase their cultural capital. A range of after-school clubs have been on offer to support all children and provide a range of opportunities outside of school. These have been subsidised for disadvantaged pupils. Led to an increase in participation at extra-curricular clubs.
Internal equipment and resources	£548	Additional resources required to support active sensory resets and to assist with introducing children to new sporting opportunities, enhancing children's experiences of PE and school and increasing the profile of physical activity.
Internal use of educational platforms and resources	£395	Subscription to GetSet4PE to support the delivery of core PE. This has provided teachers with access to high quality planning and resources to support the teach of high-quality PE.
External activities organised by School Games Organiser Network	£1610	Providing children with increased opportunities to take part in competitive sport, raising the profile of sport across the school and allowing children to maximise their potential.
