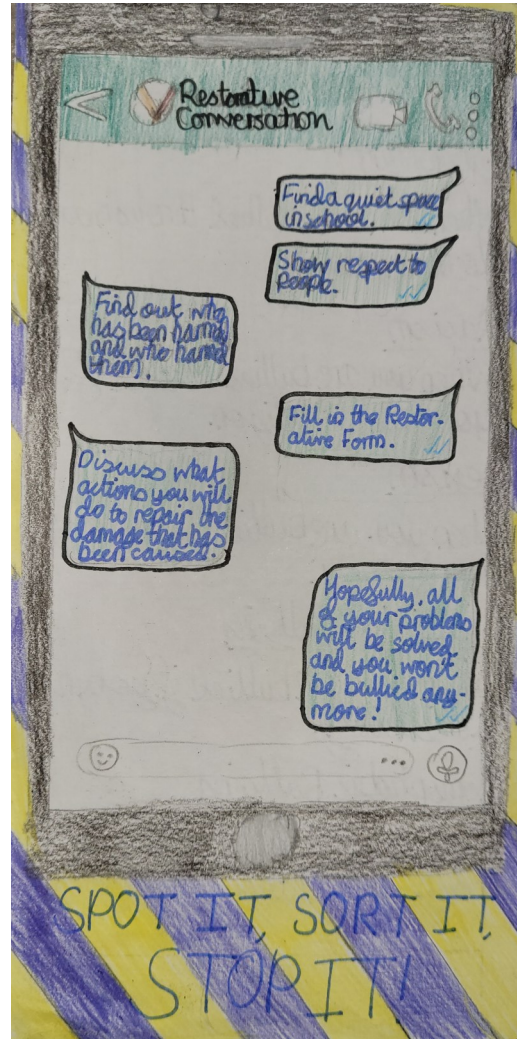

Restorative Conversation

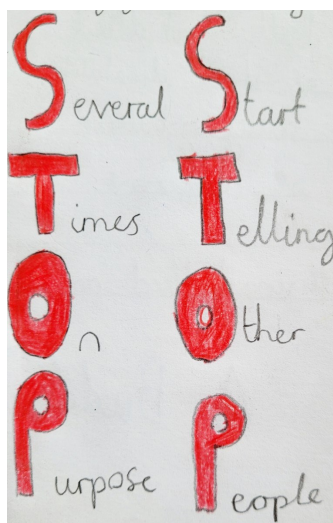
