

What is Bullying?

Stop: Start telling other people!
 Stop: Several times on purpose!

Types of Bullying

Physical Bullying

Violence and assault (hitting, pushing, kicking, biting, spitting, jostling), damaging or stealing property, damaging school work and equipment.

Verbal Bullying

Name calling, vindictive teasing, insulting remarks, threatening, taunting, homophobic/biphobic/racist remarks, harassment.

Emotional (or psychological) Bullying

Examples such as: rumour spreading, malicious gossip, intimidation, initiation or hazing violence, leaving others out.

Cyberbullying

Name calling, leaving people out, being mean through a digital device or the use of text messaging, instant messaging (MSN etc.) and social networking sites

DIFFERENT FORMS OF BULLYING!

Cyberbullying

When you are bullied through an electronic Device.

Racism

When you are bullied because of your race or religion.

Sexism

When you are bullied because of your gender

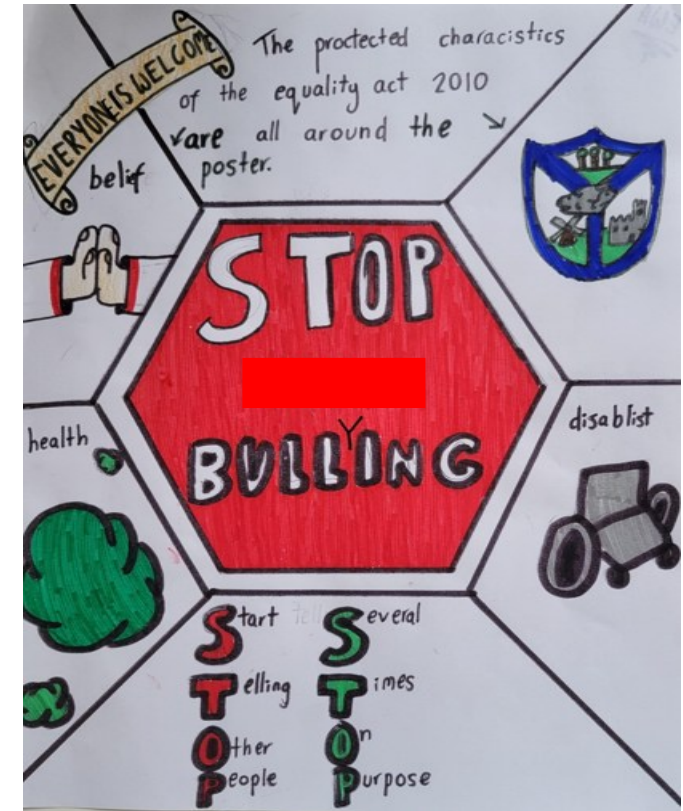
Disabilist Bullying

Our Anti-Bullying Policy

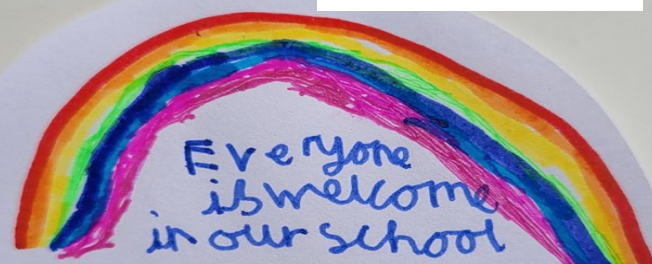
